The Spirit of Deep Sleep - Acts 20B

Acts 20:7-12 And upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight. 8 And there were many lights in the upper chamber, where they were gathered together. 9 And there sat in a window a certain young man named Eutychus, being fallen into a deep sleep: and as Paul was long preaching, he sunk down with sleep, and fell down from the third loft, and was taken up dead. 10 And Paul went down, and fell on him, and embracing him said, Trouble not yourselves; for his life is in him. 11 When he therefore was come up again, and had broken bread, and eaten, and talked a long while, even till break of day, so he departed. 12 And they brought the young man alive, and were not a little comforted.

Acts 20:7 And upon the <u>first day of the week</u>, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight.

Jesus rose the first day of the week beginning the New Covenant.

- 1 Corinthians 11 referred to the Lord's Supper.
- 2 Corinthians 10:5 Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;
- Acts 20:8-11 And there were many lights in the upper chamber, where they were gathered together. 9 And there sat in a window a certain young man named Eutychus, being <u>fallen into a deep sleep</u>: and as Paul was long preaching, he sunk down with sleep, and fell down from the third loft, and was taken up dead. 10 And Paul went down, and fell on him, and embracing him said, Trouble not yourselves; for his life is in him.
- Matthew 9:24,25 He said unto them, Give place: for the maid is <u>not dead</u>, but <u>sleepeth</u>. And they laughed him to scorn. 25 But when the people were put forth, he went in, and took her by the hand, and the maid arose.

John 11 the raising of Lazarus referred to.

Acts 20:11,12 When he therefore was come up again, and had broken bread, and eaten, and talked a long while, even <u>till break of day</u>, so he departed. 12 And they brought the young man alive, and were <u>not a little</u> comforted.

Elijah & Elisha also had people raised from the dead. Strongs #2161 Eutuchos *yoo'-too-khos* AV-Eutychus 1;

- Eutychus =" fortunate" (blessed) 1) a youth restored to life by Paul Summarized the situation of Jesus praying in the Garden the last night.
- Matthew 26:43 And he came and found them asleep again: for their <u>eyes</u> were heavy.
- 2 Kings 6:2 Kings 6:17 And Elisha prayed, and said, LORD, I pray thee, open his eyes, that he may see. And the LORD opened the eyes of the young man; and he saw: and, behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire round about Elisha.
- Mark 14:40 And when he returned, he found them asleep again, (for their eyes were heavy,) neither wist they what to answer him.
- Matthew 16:23 But he turned, and said unto Peter, <u>Get</u> thee <u>behind</u> <u>me</u>, <u>Satan</u>: thou art an offence unto <u>me</u>: for thou savourest not the things that be of God, but those that be of men.
- Romans 1 referred to for extra study.
- Romans 11:8 (According as it is written, <u>God hath given them the spirit of slumber</u>, eyes that they should not see, and ears that they should not hear;) unto this day.
- 2 Chronicles 7:13,14 If I shut up heaven that there be no rain, or if I command the locusts to devour the land, or if I send pestilence among my people; 14 If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.
- John 3:19 And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men <u>loved darkness</u> rather than light, because their deeds were evil.
- 2 Corinthians 4:4 In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them.
- John 9:39 And Jesus said, For judgment I am come into this world, that they which see not might see; and that they which see might be made blind.
- Luke 3:8 Bring forth therefore fruits worthy of repentance, and begin not to say within yourselves, We have Abraham to *our* father: for I say unto you, That <u>God</u> is <u>able</u> of these <u>stones</u> to <u>raise</u> up <u>children</u> unto Abraham.
- Genesis 2:21 And the LORD God caused a <u>deep sleep</u> to fall upon Adam, and he slept: and he took one of his ribs, and closed up the flesh instead thereof;
- God didn't make Eve from Adam's hair to rule over him. God didn't make Eve from Adam's toenail to be a slave. God made Eve from Adam's rib near his heart to love.

- Proverbs 31 referred to the virtuous woman.
- Genesis 15:12 And when the sun was going down, a <u>deep sleep</u> fell upon Abram; and, lo, an horror of great darkness fell upon him.
- 1 Samuel 26:12 So David took the spear and the cruse of water from Saul's bolster; and they gat them away, and no man saw *it*, nor knew *it*, neither awaked: for they *were* all asleep; because a <u>deep sleep from the LORD was fallen upon them</u>.
- Job 4:13 In thoughts from the visions of the night, when <u>deep sleep</u> falleth on men,
- Job 33:15 In a dream, in a vision of the night, when <u>deep</u> <u>sleep</u> falleth upon men, in slumberings upon the bed;
- Proverbs 19:15 <u>Slothfulness casteth into a deep sleep;</u> and an idle soul shall suffer hunger.
- 1 Timothy 5:8 But if any provide not for his own, and specially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel.
- Isaiah 40:29 He giveth <u>power</u> to the faint; and to *them that have* no <u>might</u> he increaseth <u>strength</u>.
- Isaiah 29:10 For the <u>LORD hath poured out upon you the spirit of deep</u> <u>sleep</u>, and hath closed your eyes: the prophets and your rulers, the seers hath He covered.
- Isreal had the 400 silent years after Malachi until John the Baptist.
- Daniel 8:18 Now as he was speaking with me, I was in a <u>deep sleep on my</u> <u>face toward the ground</u>: but he touched me, and set me upright.
- Exodus 3:2 And the angel of the LORD appeared unto him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush: and he looked, and, behold, the bush <u>burned</u> with fire, and the bush <u>was not consumed</u>.
- Daniel 10:9 Yet heard I the voice of his words: and when I heard the voice of his words, then was I in a <u>deep sleep</u> on my face, and my face toward the ground.
- Acts 20:9 And there sat in a window a certain young man named Eutychus, being fallen into a <u>deep sleep</u>: & as Paul was long preaching, he sunk down with sleep, & fell down from the third loft, & was taken up dead.
- Isaiah 29:9-16 Stay yourselves, and wonder; cry ye out, and cry: they are drunken, but not with wine; they stagger, but not with strong drink. 10 For the LORD hath poured out upon you the spirit of deep sleep, and hath closed your eyes: the prophets and your rulers, the seers hath He covered. 11 And the vision of all is become unto you as the words of a book that is sealed, which *men* deliver to one that is learned, saying, Read this, I pray thee: and he saith, I cannot; for it *is* sealed: 12 And the book is delivered to him that is not learned, saying, Read this, I pray

thee: and he saith, I am not learned. 13 Wherefore the Lord said, Forasmuch as this people draw near me with their mouth, and with their lips do honour me, but have removed their heart far from me, and their fear toward me is taught by the precept of men: 14 Therefore, behold, I will proceed to do a marvellous work among this people, even a marvellous work and a wonder: for the wisdom of their wise men shall perish, and the understanding of their prudent men shall be hid. 15 Woe unto them that seek deep to hide their counsel from the LORD, and their works are in the dark, and they say, Who seeth us? and who knoweth us? 16 Surely your turning of things upside down shall be esteemed as the potter's clay: for shall the work say of him that made it, He made me not? or shall the thing framed say of him that framed it, He had no understanding?

Isaiah 29:14 Therefore, behold, <u>I will proceed to do a marvellous work</u> among this people, even a marvellous work and a wonder: for the <u>wisdom of their wise men shall perish</u>, and the <u>understanding of their prudent men</u> shall be hid.

Leviticus 26 Summarized the 7 time punishment chapter.

Isrealites read the writings of the experts' targums about the Word of God instead of reading the Word of God.

Matthew 23 referred to the 8 woes of Jesus to the Religious leaders.

Isaiah has many woes also to the Isrealites.

Isaiah 29:15 Woe unto them that <u>seek deep to hide their counsel from the LORD</u>, and their works are in the dark, and they say, Who seeth us? and who knoweth us?

Ezekiel 8 summarized about God's knot hole vision to Ezekiel.

1 Timothy 4:2 Speaking lies in hypocrisy; having their <u>conscience seared</u> with a hot iron;

Jesus cleaned out His temple twice:

John 2:15,16 And when he had made a scourge of small <u>cords</u>, he drove them all out of the temple, and the sheep, and the oxen; and poured out the changers' money, and overthrew the <u>tables</u>; 16 And said unto them that sold doves, Take these things hence; make not my Father's house an house of merchandise.

Luke 19:45 And he went into the temple, and began to cast out them that sold therein, and them that bought; 46 Saying unto them, It is written, My house is the house of prayer: but ye have made it a <u>den</u> of <u>thieves</u>.

Isaiah 29:16 Surely your turning of things upside down shall be esteemed as the potter's clay: for shall the work say of him that made it, He made me not? or shall the thing framed say of him that framed it, He had no

understanding?

- 1 Samuel 1&2 Summarized about Eli's sons errors.
- Isaiah 5:20 Woe unto them that <u>call evil good</u>, and <u>good evil</u>; that put darkness for light, and light for darkness; that put bitter for sweet, and sweet for bitter!
- 1 Corinthians 11:28,30 But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of *that* bread, and drink of *that* cup. 30 For this cause many *are* weak and sickly among you, and many sleep.
- Roman 12:1,2 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.
