## Where Are The Nazarites - Acts 21D

- Acts 21:19 And when he had saluted them, he declared particularly what things God had wrought among the Gentiles by his ministry.
- John 5 Jesus healed the lame man after 38 years at the pool.
- Acts 21:20-26 And when they heard it, they glorified the Lord, and said unto him, Thou seest, brother, how many thousands of Jews there are which believe; and they are all zealous of the law: 21 And they are informed of thee, that thou teachest all the Jews which are among the Gentiles to forsake Moses, saying that they ought not to circumcise their children, neither to walk after the customs. 22 What is it therefore? the multitude must needs come together; for they will hear that thou art come. 23 Do therefore this that we say to thee: We have four men which have a vow on them; 24 Them take, and purify thyself with them, and be at charges with them, that they may shave their heads: and all may know that those things, whereof they were informed concerning thee, are nothing; but that thou thyself also walkest orderly, and keepest the law. 25 As touching the Gentiles which believe, we have written and concluded that they observe no such thing, save only that they keep themselves from things offered to idols, and from blood, and from strangled, and from fornication. 26 Then Paul took the men, and the next day purifying himself with them entered into the temple, to signify the accomplishment of the days of purification, until that an offering should be offered for every one of them.

- Matthew 9:38 <u>Pray</u> ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will <u>send</u> forth <u>labourers</u> into his harvest.
- Revelation 19:11 And I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse; and he that sat upon him *was* called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he doth judge and make war.
- Revelation 22:20 He which testifieth these things saith, Surely I come quickly. Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus.
- John 2:17 And his disciples remembered that it was written, The zeal of

- thine house hath eaten me up. Jesus.
- Acts 21:21 And they are informed of thee, that thou teachest all the Jews which are among the Gentiles to forsake Moses, saying that they ought not to circumcise *their* children, neither to walk after the customs.
- Acts 15:1 And certain men which came down from Judaea taught the brethren, *and said*, Except ye be circumcised after the manner of Moses, ye cannot be saved.
- Acts 21:22-25 What is it therefore? the multitude must needs come together: for they will hear that thou art come. 23 Do therefore this that we say to thee: We have four men which have a vow on them; (a Nazarite vow) 24 Them take, and purify thyself with them, and be at charges with them, that they may shave *their* heads: and all may know that those things, whereof they were informed concerning thee, are nothing; but that thou thyself also walkest orderly, and keepest the law. 25 As touching the Gentiles which believe, we have written and concluded that they observe no such thing, save only that they keep themselves from things offered to idols, and from blood, and from strangled, and from fornication.
- Acts 15:20 But that we write unto them, that they abstain from pollutions of idols, and *from* fornication, and *from* things strangled, and *from* blood.
- Acts 21:26,27 Then Paul took the men, and the next day purifying himself with them entered into the temple, to signify the accomplishment of the days of purification, until that an offering should be offered for every one of them. 27 And when the seven days were almost ended, the Jews which were of Asia, when they saw him in the temple, stirred up all the people, and laid hands on him,
- Our Lord Jesus ministered to many thousands. Feeding the 4000 & 5000, etc.
- Matthew 4:23,24 And Jesus went about all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all manner of sickness and all manner of disease among the people. 24 And his fame went throughout all Syria: and they brought unto him all sick people that were taken with divers diseases and torments, and those which were possessed with devils, and those which were lunatick, and those that had the palsy; and he healed them.
- Acts 2:41 Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added *unto them* about 3,000 souls.
- Acts 4:4 Howbeit many of them which heard the word believed; and the number of the men was about 5,000.
- Acts 19:19 Many of them also which used curious arts brought their books

- together, and burned them before all *men*: and they counted the price of them, and found *it* 50,000 *pieces* of silver.
- Acts 21:20 And when they heard *it*, they glorified the Lord, and said unto him, Thou seest, brother, how <u>many thousands</u> of Jews there are which believe; and they are all zealous of the law:
- Acts 21:38 Art not thou that Egyptian, which before these days madest an uproar, and leddest out into the wilderness 4,000 men that were murderers?
- 2 Corinthians 6:2 (For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured (helped) thee: behold, now *is* the accepted time; behold, now *is* the day of salvation.)
- Deuteronomy 10:16 <u>Circumcise</u> therefore the foreskin of your <u>heart</u>, and be no more stiffnecked.
- 1 Samuel 15: 22 And Samuel said, Hath the LORD as great delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices, as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, and to hearken than the fat of rams.
- Deuteronomy 30:6 And the LORD thy <u>God will circumcise thine heart, and</u> the heart of thy seed, to love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, that thou mayest live.
- Jeremiah 4:4 <u>Circumcise yourselves</u> to the LORD, and <u>take away the</u>
  <u>foreskins of your heart</u>, ye men of Judah and inhabitants of Jerusalem:
  lest my fury come forth like fire, and burn that none can quench *it*,
  because of the evil of your doings.
- Romans 2:29 <u>But he *is* a Jew, which is one inwardly; and circumcision *is* that of the heart, in the spirit, and not in the letter; whose praise *is* not of men, but of God.</u>
- Exodus 8:1 And the LORD spake unto Moses, <u>Go</u> unto Pharaoh, and say unto him, Thus saith the LORD, <u>Let my people go</u>, that they may serve me.
- **Concise Bible Dictionary Nazarite**
- This term implies 'separation'; it was applied to either man or woman that vowed to separate themselves unto the Lord. Three things especially were enjoined upon the Nazarite.
- 1. He must not touch strong drink or anything that came of the vine: typical of turning away from sources of earthly energy and joy.
- 2. No razor must come upon his head: suggestive of the renunciation of self, and the giving up of natural rights and proprieties as man: cf. #1Corinthians 11:7,14.
- 3. He must not touch any dead body: typical of avoiding contact with moral defilement, the sphere of death and alienation from God brought about

- through sin. The point of the Nazarite was to live to God.
- If any one died suddenly near to a Nazarite, he was defiled: he had to shave his head, offer sacrifices, and commence all again. When the period of his separation was fulfilled, he was to offer a burnt offering, a sin offering, a peace offering, a meat offering, and a drink offering, with the addition of the offerings made at the consecration of the priests. He was to shave his head and burn the hair in the fire which was under the peace offering: type of the full communion, which is the result of the sacrifice of Christ. #Numbers 6:1-21.
- The Nazarite was specially raised up of God as the vessel of His power on behalf of the people when the pressure under which they were suffering was from enemies within their own border (as the Philistines), and when owing to the moral condition of the people it was not possible for God to interfere in ordinary ways of deliverance. The Nazarite was marked on the one hand by a special energy of the Spirit of God, but on the other by rigid separation from the natural sources of excitement, the proprieties and the moral corruption which were connected with the life of the people. We see this in John the Baptist.
- Samson was a Nazarite from his birth. Before he was born it was declared that no razor must come on his head. His mission was to deliver Israel from the hand of the Philistines. Samson betrayed his secret, but sealed his mission by his own death. #Judges 13:1-5.
- Christ was morally the true Nazarite; He was the holy one, and instead of having earthly joy He was emphatically 'the man of sorrows' when here, but also He has died to sin and lives to God. He answered to all the sacrifices, but the day is approaching when He will drink wine anew in the kingdom, as He said in #Matthew 26:29; and be able to say to others, "Eat, O friends; drink, yea, drink abundantly, O beloved." Christians also are Nazarites to God, not because of any vow, but as sanctified in Christ Jesus. He said, "For their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified through the truth." #John 17:19 1Corinthians 1:2.
- Our Lord Jesus Christ shed His blood on Calvary for us. Revelation 1:5 And from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, and the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood,
- Deuteronomy 10:16 <u>Circumcise</u> therefore the foreskin of your <u>heart</u>, and be no more stiffnecked.
- Deuteronomy 30:6 And the LORD thy God will <u>circumcise</u> thine <u>heart</u>, and the <u>heart</u> of thy seed, to love the LORD thy God with all thine <u>heart</u>, and with all thy soul, that thou mayest live.

- Jeremiah 4:4 <u>Circumcise</u> yourselves to the LORD, and take away the foreskins of your <u>heart</u>, ye men of Judah and inhabitants of Jerusalem: lest my fury come forth like fire, and burn that none can quench *it*, because of the evil of your doings.
- Romans 2:29 But he *is* a Jew, which is one inwardly; and <u>circumcision</u> *is* that of the <u>heart</u>, in the spirit, and not in the letter; whose praise *is* not of men, but of God.
- Job 41:24 His <u>heart</u> is as firm as a <u>stone</u>; yea, as hard as a piece of the nether *millstone*.
- 1 Thessalonians 5:19 Quench not the Spirit.
- Numbers 6:1-12 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, 2 Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, When either man or woman shall separate themselves to vow a vow of a Nazarite, to separate themselves unto the LORD: 3 He shall separate himself from wine and strong drink, and shall drink no vinegar of wine, or vinegar of strong drink, neither shall he drink any liquor of grapes, nor eat moist grapes, or dried. 4 All the days of his separation shall he eat nothing that is made of the vine tree, from the kernels even to the husk. 5 All the days of the vow of his separation there shall no razor come upon his head: until the days be fulfilled, in the which he separateth himself unto the LORD, he shall be holy, and shall let the locks of the hair of his head grow. 6 All the days that he separateth himself unto the LORD he shall come at no dead body. 7 He shall not make himself unclean for his father, or for his mother, for his brother, or for his sister, when they die: because the consecration of his God is upon his head. 8 All the days of his separation he is holy unto the LORD. (Spend more time with the Lord.) 9 And if any man die very suddenly by him, and he hath defiled the head of his consecration; then he shall shave his head in the day of his cleansing, on the seventh day shall he shave it. 10 And on the eighth day he shall bring two turtles (doves), or two young pigeons, to the priest, to the door of the tabernacle of the congregation: 11 And the priest shall offer the one for a sin offering, and the other for a burnt offering, and make an atonement for him, for that he sinned by the dead, and shall hallow his head that same day. 12 And he shall consecrate unto the LORD the days of his separation, and shall bring a lamb of the first year for a trespass offering: but the days that were before shall be lost, because his separation was defiled.
- John 14:6 Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.
- 1 John 9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins,

and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Numbers 6:13-21 And this is the law of the Nazarite, when the days of his separation are fulfilled: he shall be brought unto the door of the tabernacle of the congregation: 14 And he shall offer his offering unto the LORD, one he lamb of the first year without blemish for a burnt offering, and one ewe lamb of the first year without blemish for a sin offering, and one ram without blemish for peace offerings, 15 And a basket of unleavened bread, cakes of fine flour mingled with oil, and wafers of unleavened bread anointed with oil, and their meat offering, and their drink offerings. 16 And the priest shall bring them before the LORD, and shall offer his sin offering, and his burnt offering: 17 And he shall offer the ram for a sacrifice of peace offerings unto the LORD, with the basket of unleavened bread: the priest shall offer also his meat offering, and his drink offering. 18 And the Nazarite shall shave the head of his separation at the door of the tabernacle of the congregation, and shall take the hair of the head of his separation, and put it in the fire which is under the sacrifice of the peace offerings. 19 And the priest shall take the sodden shoulder of the ram, and one unleavened cake out of the basket, and one unleavened wafer, and shall put them upon the hands of the Nazarite, after the hair of his separation is shaven: 20 And the priest shall wave them for a wave offering before the LORD: this is holy for the priest, with the wave breast and heave shoulder: and after that the Nazarite may drink wine. 21 This is the law of the Nazarite who hath vowed, and of his offering unto the LORD for his separation, beside that that his hand shall get: according to the vow which he vowed, so he must do after the law of his separation.

Matthew 11:11 Verily I say unto you, Among them that are born of women there hath not risen a <u>greater than John</u> the Baptist: notwithstanding he that is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

Romans 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye <u>present your bodies a living sacrifice</u>, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. (willingly offered to God)

Jesus lived in an unclean world full of sin yet was clean.

Acts 2 baptised in the Holy Spirit.

Genesis 39:12 And she caught him by his garment, saying, Lie with me: and he left his garment in her hand, and fled, and got him out. (Joseph)

Romans 12:2 And be <u>not conformed to this world</u>: but be ye transformed by the <u>renewing of your mind</u>, that ye may prove what *is* that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

2 Corinthians 10:5 Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that

- exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;
- Romans 12:3 For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think *of himself* more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith.
- Lamentations 4:7 Her Nazarites were purer than snow, they were whiter than milk, they were more ruddy in body than rubies, their polishing *was* of sapphire:
- Amos 2:11,12 And I raised up of your sons for prophets, and of your young men for Nazarites. *Is it* not even thus, O ye children of Israel? saith the LORD. 12 But ye gave the Nazarites wine to drink; and commanded the prophets, saying, Prophesy not.
- Amos prayed interceding 4 times & God held back judgement 3 times, but not the forth time.

Numbers 6:22-27 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, 23 Speak unto Aaron and unto his sons, saying, On this wise ye shall bless the children of Israel, saying unto them, 24 The LORD bless thee, and keep thee: 25 The LORD make his face shine upon thee, and be gracious unto thee: 26 The LORD lift up his countenance upon thee, and give thee peace. 27 And they shall put my name upon the children of Israel; and I will bless them.
