## The Futility of Assaulting God's Leaders - Acts 23A

- Acts 23:1-5 And Paul, earnestly beholding the council, said, Men and brethren, I have lived in all good conscience before God until this day. 2 And the high priest Ananias commanded them that stood by him to smite him on the mouth. 3 Then said Paul unto him, God shall smite thee, thou whited wall: for sittest thou to judge me after the law, and commandest me to be smitten contrary to the law? 4 And they that stood by said, Revilest thou God's high priest? 5 Then said Paul, I wist not, brethren, that he was the high priest: for it is written, Thou shalt not speak evil of the ruler of thy people.
- Acts 23:1 And Paul, earnestly beholding the council, said, Men and brethren, <u>I have lived in all good conscience before God</u> until this day. Paul gave his pedigree in the chapter prior.
- 1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- John 14:6 Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.
- Acts 23:2,3 And the high priest Ananias commanded them that stood by him to smite (punch) him on the mouth. 3 Then said Paul unto him, God shall smite thee, thou whited wall: for sittest thou to judge me after the law, and commandest me to be smitten contrary to the law?
- The high priest was abusing his authority & power. We are to pray for our leaders. 1 Timothy 2:1,2 I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, *and* giving of thanks, be made for all men; 2 For kings, and *for* all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty.
- Acts 23:4,5 And they that stood by said, Revilest thou God's high priest? 5 Then said Paul, I wist not, brethren, that he was the high priest: for it is written, Thou shalt not speak evil of the ruler of thy people.
- 1 Timothy 1:5 Now the end of the commandment is charity out of a <u>pure</u> <u>heart</u>, and *of* a <u>good conscience</u>, and *of* faith unfeigned:
- 1 Timothy 1:19 <u>Holding faith</u>, and a <u>good conscience</u>; which some having put away concerning faith have made shipwreck:
- Romans 10:17 faith *comes* by hearing, and hearing by the word of God. Hebrews 13:18 Pray for us: for we trust we have a good conscience, in all things willing to live honestly.
- 1 Peter 3:16 Having a good conscience; that, whereas they speak evil of

- you, as of evildoers, they may be ashamed that <u>falsely accuse your good</u> conversation in Christ.
- 1 Peter 3:21 The like figure whereunto *even* baptism doth also now save us (not the putting away of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a <u>good conscience</u> toward God,) by the resurrection of Jesus Christ:
- Jude 1:9 Yet Michael the archangel, when contending with the devil he disputed about the body of Moses, durst not bring against him a railing accusation, but said, The Lord rebuke thee.
- John 8:11 She said, <u>No</u> man, Lord. And Jesus said unto her, Neither do I condemn thee: go, and sin no more.
- Smith's Revised Bible Dictionary ANANI'AS (hynne, or hynnx *Jehovah is* gracious: Ananiav). 1. A high-priest in (#Ac 23:2 ff. xxiv:1), before whom Paul attempted to defend himself, in the Jewish Council at Jerusalem, but was silenced with a blow on the mouth for asserting that he had always "lived in all good conscience before God." See, in regard to that incident, Paul. He was the son of Nebedaeus (Joseph. Ant. xx. 5, 2), succeeded Joseph son of Camydus (Ant. xx. 1, 3, 5, 2), and preceded Ismael son of Phabi (Ant. xx. 8, 8, 11). He was nominated to the office by Herod king of Chaleis, in a. d. 48 (Ant. xx. 5, 2); and in a. d. 52 sent to Rome by the prefect Ummidius Quadratus to answer before the Emperor Claudius a charge of oppression brought by the Samaritans (Ant. xx. 6, 2). He appears, however, not to have lost his office, but to have resumed it on his return. This has been doubted; but Wieseler (Chronol. d. Apostol. Zeitalters, p. 76, note) has shown that it was so in all probability, seeing that the procurator Cumanus, who went to Rome with him as his adversary, was unsuccessful, and was condemned to banishment. He was deposed from his office shortly before Felix left the province (Ant. xx. 8, 8); but still had great power which he used violently and lawlessly (Ant. xx. 9, 2.) He was at last assassinated by the Sicarii (B. J. ii. 17, 9) at the beginning of the last Jewish war.
- John 18:11 Then said Jesus unto Peter, <u>Put up thy sword</u> into the sheath: the cup which my Father hath given me, shall I not drink it?
- Deuteronomy 28:48 Therefore shalt thou serve thine enemies which the LORD shall send against thee, in hunger, and in thirst, and in nakedness, and in want of all *things*: and he shall put a <u>yoke</u> of <u>iron</u> upon thy neck, until he have destroyed thee.
- Jeremiah 28:14 For thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel; I have put a <u>yoke</u> of <u>iron</u> upon the neck of all these nations, that they may serve Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon; and they shall serve him: and I have given him the beasts of the field also.

- 2 Corinthians 11 Summarized Paul's list of afflictions he went through. Jeremiah 20:1-6 Now Pashur the son of Immer the priest, who was also chief governor in the house of the LORD, heard that Jeremiah prophesied these things. 2 Then Pashur smote Jeremiah the prophet, and put him in the stocks that *were* in the high gate of Benjamin, which was by the house of the LORD. 3 And it came to pass on the morrow, that Pashur brought forth Jeremiah out of the stocks. Then said Jeremiah unto him, The LORD hath not called thy name Pashur, but Magormissabib. 4 For thus saith the LORD, Behold, I will make thee a terror to thyself, and to all thy friends: and they shall fall by the sword of their enemies, and thine eyes shall behold it: and I will give all Judah into the hand of the king of Babylon, and he shall carry them captive into Babylon, and shall slay them with the sword. 5 Moreover I will deliver all the strength of this city, and all the labours thereof, and all the precious things thereof, and all the treasures of the kings of Judah will I give into the hand of their enemies, which shall spoil them, and take them, and carry them to Babylon, 6 And thou, Pashur, and all that dwell in thine house shall go into captivity: and thou shalt come to Babylon, and there thou shalt die, and shalt be buried there, thou, and all thy friends, to whom thou hast prophesied lies.
- Jeremiah 20:1-4 Now Pashur the son of Immer the priest, who was also chief governor in the house of the LORD, heard that Jeremiah prophesied these things. 2 Then Pashur smote (punched) Jeremiah the prophet, and put him in the stocks that were in the high gate of Benjamin, which was by the house of the LORD. 3 And it came to pass on the morrow, that Pashur brought forth Jeremiah out of the stocks. Then said Jeremiah unto him, The LORD hath not called thy name Pashur, but Magormissabib. 4 For thus saith the LORD, Behold, I will make thee a terror to thyself, and to all thy friends: and they shall fall by the sword of their enemies, and thine eyes shall behold it: and I will give all Judah into the hand of the king of Babylon, and he shall carry them captive into Babylon, and shall slay them with the sword.
- Acts 17:22 Then Paul stood in the midst of Mars' hill, and said, *Ye* men of Athens, I perceive that in all things ye are too superstitious.
- Jeremiah 20:5,6 Moreover I will deliver all the strength of this city, and all the labours thereof, and all the precious things thereof, and all the treasures of the kings of Judah will I give into the hand of their enemies, which shall spoil them, and take them, and carry them to Babylon. 6 And thou, Pashur, and all that dwell in thine house shall go into captivity: and thou shalt come to Babylon, and there thou shalt die, and shalt be buried

there, thou, and all thy friends, to whom thou hast prophesied lies.

Jeremiah 28:10-17 Then Hananiah the prophet took the yoke (of wood) from off the prophet Jeremiah's neck, and brake it. 11 And Hananiah spake in the presence of all the people, saying, Thus saith the LORD; Even so will I break the yoke of Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon from the neck of all nations within the space of two full years. And the prophet Jeremiah went his way. 12 Then the word of the LORD came unto Jeremiah the prophet, after that Hananiah the prophet had broken the voke from off the neck of the prophet Jeremiah, saying, 13 Go and tell Hananiah, saying, Thus saith the LORD; Thou hast broken the yokes of wood; but thou shalt make for them yokes of iron. 14 For thus saith the LORD of hosts, the God of Israel; I have put a yoke of iron upon the neck of all these nations, that they may serve Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon; and they shall serve him: and I have given him the beasts of the field also. 15 Then said the prophet Jeremiah unto Hananiah the prophet, Hear now, Hananiah; The LORD hath not sent thee; but thou makest this people to trust in a lie. 16 Therefore thus saith the LORD; Behold, I will cast thee from off the face of the earth: this year thou shalt die, because thou hast taught rebellion against the LORD. 17 So Hananiah the prophet died the same year in the seventh month.

Hananiah the prophet assulted God's prophet Jeremiah.

- 1 Samuel 8:7 And the LORD said unto Samuel, Hearken unto the voice of the people in all that they say unto <u>thee</u>: for they have not <u>rejected</u> thee, but they have <u>rejected</u> me, that I should not reign over them.
- 1 John 4:1 Beloved, believe not every <u>spirit</u>, but <u>try</u> the <u>spirits</u> whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world.
- Jeremiah 28:10-17 Then Hananiah the prophet took the yoke (of wood) from off the prophet Jeremiah's neck, and brake it. 11 And Hananiah spake in the presence of all the people, saying, Thus saith the LORD; Even so will I break the yoke of Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon from the neck of all nations within the space of two full years. Romans 3:23 For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;
Acts 13 Summarized of Elymas the sorcerer withstanding God against Paul lost his sight for a season.

Revelation 11:3 And I will give power unto my two witnesses, and they shall <u>prophesy</u> a thousand two hundred and threescore days, clothed in sackcloth.

Saying Repent, Repent like john the Baptist & Jonah.

Revelation 11:4,5 These are the two olive trees, and the two candlesticks standing before the God of the earth. 5 And if any man will hurt them,

fire proceedeth out of their mouth, and devoureth their enemies: and if any man will hurt them, he must in this manner be killed.

Revelation 19:11,15 And I saw heaven opened, and behold a white horse; and he that sat upon him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he doth judge and make war. 15 And out of his mouth goeth a sharp sword, that with it he should smite the nations: and he shall rule them with a rod of iron: and he treadeth the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God.

( with the modern TV & satelite) 10 And they that dwell upon the earth shall rejoice over them, and make merry, and shall send gifts one to another; because these two prophets tormented them that dwelt on the earth. 11 And after three days and an half the Spirit of life from God entered into them, and they stood upon their feet; and great fear fell upon them which saw them. 12 And they heard a great voice from heaven saying unto them, Come up hither. And they ascended up to heaven in a cloud; and their enemies beheld them.

Acts 1:9 And when He had spoken these things, while they beheld, He was taken up; and a cloud received Him out of their sight.

Revelation 11:13 the same hour was there a great earthquake, & the tenth part of the city fell, & in the earthquake were slain of men 7000: & the remnant were affrighted, & gave glory to the God of heaven.

Nebuchadnezzar & Pharoah knew God but did not get saved.

James 2:19 Thou believest that there is one God; thou doest well: the devils also believe, and tremble.

Luke 11:47-51 Woe unto you! for ye build the sepulchres of the prophets, and your fathers killed them. 48 Truly ye bear witness that ye allow the deeds of your fathers: for they indeed killed them, and ye build their sepulchres. 49 Therefore also said the wisdom of God, I will send them prophets & apostles, & *some* of them they shall slay & persecute: 50 That the blood of all the prophets, which was shed from the foundation

of the world, may be required of this generation; 51 From the blood of Abel unto the blood of Zacharias, which perished between the altar & the temple: verily I say unto you, It shall be required of this generation.

Revelation 6:10,11 And they cried with a loud voice, saying, <u>How long</u>, O <u>Lord</u>, holy and true, dost thou not judge and avenge our blood on them that dwell on the earth? 11 And white robes were given unto every one of them; and it was said unto them, that they should rest yet for a little season, until their fellowservants also and their brethren, that should be killed as they *were*, should be fulfilled.

Daniel 5 account of Belshazzar summarized.

Ezekiel 22:30 And I sought for a man among them, that should make up the hedge, and stand in the gap before me for the land, that I should not destroy it: but I found none.
