Abandoning All Hope - Acts 27B

Summarized this last trip of Paul & the dangers faced thus far.

- Acts 27:12-20 And because the haven was not commodious to winter in, the more part advised to depart thence also, if by any means they might attain to Phenice, and there to winter; which is an haven of Crete, and lieth toward the south west and north west. 13 And when the south wind blew softly, supposing that they had obtained their purpose, loosing thence, they sailed close by Crete. 14 But not long after there arose against it a tempestuous wind, called Euroclydon. 15 And when the ship was caught, and could not bear up into the wind, we let her drive. 16 And running under a certain island which is called Clauda, we had much work to come by the boat: 17 Which when they had taken up, they used helps, undergirding the ship; and, fearing lest they should fall into the quicksands, strake sail, and so were driven. 18 And we being exceedingly tossed with a tempest, the next day they lightened the ship; 19 And the third *day* we cast out with our own hands the tackling of the ship. 20 And when neither sun nor stars in many days appeared, and no small tempest lay on *us*, <u>all hope that we should be saved was then</u> taken away.
- Paul intercedes for all on the ship. Acts 27:24 Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee.
- Acts 27:12 And because the harbor was not suitable to winter in, the majority advised to set sail from there also, if by any means they could reach Phoenix, a harbor of Crete opening toward the southwest and northwest, *and* winter *there*.
- Summarized of Jonah rushing away from God's will.
- Jonah 1:5 Then the mariners were afraid, and cried every man unto his god, and cast forth the wares that were in the ship into the sea, to lighten it of them. But Jonah was gone down into the sides of the ship; and he lay, and was fast asleep.
- The devil had done this many times trying to afflict Our Lord on the Sea of Galilee
- Acts 27:13 When the south wind blew softly, supposing that they had obtained *their* desire, putting out to sea, they sailed close by Crete.
- Luke 21:8 And he said, Take heed that ye <u>be not deceived</u>: for many shall come in my name, saying, I am *Christ*; and the time draweth near: go ye <u>not</u> therefore after them.
- Revelation 3:7 And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write; These things saith he that is holy, he that is true, he that hath the key of David,

- he that openeth, and no man shutteth; and shutteth, and no man openeth;
- Acts 27:14-16 But not long after, a tempestuous head wind arose, called Euroclydon. 15 So when the ship was caught, and could not head into the wind, we let *her* drive. 16 And running under *the shelter of* an island called Clauda, we secured the skiff with difficulty. (battoning down the hatches)
- When under attack, confess sins of self, fathers, netion, associates, etc.

 Then close doors open for the devil to attack through.
- Acts 27:17-19 When they had taken it on board, they used cables to undergird the ship; and <u>fearing</u> lest they should run aground on the Syrtis *Sands* (like Sable Island's deadly sand bar.), they struck sail and so were driven. 18 And because we were exceedingly tempest-tossed, the next *day* they lightened the ship. 19 On the third *day* we threw the ship's tackle overboard with our own hands. (an act of despiration).
- 1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
- Acts 27:20 Now when neither sun nor stars appeared for many days, and no small tempest beat on *us*, <u>all hope that we would be saved was finally given up</u>.
- In times of disaster, it is important to minister to those afflicted.
- Matthew 27:20 But the chief priests and elders persuaded the multitude that they should ask Barabbas, and destroy Jesus.
- 2 Corinthians 2:6 This punishment which was inflicted by the majority is sufficient for such a man,
- 2 Corinthians 9:2 for I know your willingness, about which I boast of you to the Macedonians, that Achaia was ready a year ago; and your zeal has stirred up the majority.
- 1 Corinthians 16:15 I beseech you, brethren, (ye know the house of Stephanas, that it is the firstfruits of Achaia, and *that* they have <u>addicted</u> themselves to the <u>ministry</u> of the <u>saints</u>,)
- 1 Peter 5:8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:
- 2 Corinthians 6:14 Be ye not <u>unequally yoked</u> together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?
- John 16:13 Howbeit when he, the <u>Spirit</u> of truth, is come, he will <u>guide</u> you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, *that* shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come.
- Psalms 37:1-4 *A Psalm* of David. <u>Fret not</u> thyself because of evildoers, neither be thou envious against the workers of iniquity. 2 For they shall soon be cut down like the grass, and wither as the green herb. 3 <u>Trust in</u>

- the LORD, and do good; so shalt thou dwell in the land, and verily thou shalt be fed. 4 Delight thyself also in the LORD; and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart.
- Ephesians 5:20 Giving <u>thanks</u> <u>always</u> for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ;
- Psalms 37:5,6 <u>Commit thy way unto the LORD; trust also in him; and he shall bring it to pass</u>. 6 And he shall bring forth thy righteousness as the light, and thy judgment as the noonday.
- Daniel & Joseph were taken away as slaves yet God made them rulers of the nation.
- Psalms 37:7 Rest in the LORD, and wait patiently for him: fret not thyself because of him who prospereth in his way, because of the man who bringeth wicked devices to pass.
- Concise Bible Dictionary Euroclydon eurokludwn. The name used by the sailors for a tempestuous wind (hurricane) in the Mediterranean, experienced, when Paul was being taken to Rome. #Acts 27:14. The etymology of the word is not known: some MSS read enrukulwn, euraquilo. It may simply imply a furious wind, like a Levanter in modern times, irrespective of the quarter from whence it blew.
- Hebrews 1:7,14 And of the angels he saith, Who maketh his angels spirits, and his ministers a flame of fire. 14 Are they not all ministering spirits, sent forth to minister for them who shall be heirs of salvation?
- Psalm 31:15 My times *are* in thy hand: deliver me from the hand of mine enemies, and from them that persecute me.
- 1 Corinthian 13:13 And now abideth faith, hope, charity, these three; but the greatest of these *is* charity.
- John 14:2,3 In my Father's house are many mansions: if *it were* not *so*, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. John 14:3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, *there* ye may be also.
- 1 John 2:1 My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an <u>advocate</u> with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous:
- Luke 22:32 But I have prayed for thee, that thy <u>faith</u> fail not: and when thou art converted, <u>strengthen</u> thy brethren.
- Psalm 23 referred to V4 Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou *art* with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.
- Genesis 39:7-9 And it came to pass after these things, that his master's wife cast her eyes upon Joseph; and she said, Lie with me. 8 But he refused, and said unto his master's wife, Behold, my master wotteth not what is with me in the house, and he hath committed all that he hath to

- my hand; 9 *There is* none greater in this house than I; neither hath he kept back any thing from me but thee, because thou *art* his wife: how then can I do this great wickedness, and <u>sin against God</u>?
- Psalms 51:4 <u>Against Thee, Thee only, have I sinned</u>, and done *this* evil in Thy sight: that Thou mightest be justified when thou speakest, *and* be clear when Thou judgest.
- Proverbs warns often young men of the strange woman.
- Genesis 39:10,11 And it came to pass, as she spake to Joseph day by day, that he hearkened not unto her, to lie by her, or to be with her. 11 And it came to pass about this time, that Joseph went into the house to do his business; and there was none of the men of the house there within.
- Genesis 39:12 And she caught him by his garment, saying, Lie with me: and he left his garment in her hand, and fled, and got him out.
- Psalms 31:24 Be of good courage, and he shall strengthen your heart, all ye that <u>hope</u> in the <u>LORD</u>.
- John 15:20 Remember the word that I said unto you, The servant is not greater than his lord. If they have <u>persecuted</u> me, they will also persecute you; if they have kept my saying, they will keep yours also.
- Matthew 6:20 But lay up for yourselves <u>treasures</u> in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth corrupt, and where thieves do not break through nor steal:
- 2 Corinthians 11 Summarized Paul's perils.
- 2 Corinthians 1:3,4 Blessed *be* God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort; 4 Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are comforted of God.
- John 13:34,35 A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. 35 By this shall all *men* know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.
- Revelation 12:11 And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death.
- Matthew 8:29 And, behold, they cried out, saying, What have we to do with thee, Jesus, thou Son of God? art thou come hither to <u>torment</u> us <u>before</u> the time?

More Service Notes:

Ezra 10:2 And Shechaniah the son of Jehiel, *one* of the sons of Elam, answered and said unto Ezra, We have trespassed against our <u>God</u>, and have taken strange wives of the people of the land: yet now there is <u>hope</u> in Israel concerning this thing.

- Job 8:13 So *are* the paths of all that forget <u>God</u>; and the hypocrite's <u>hope</u> shall perish:
- Job 27:8 For what *is* the <u>hope</u> of the hypocrite, though he hath gained, when <u>God</u> taketh away his soul?
- Psalms 33:18,22 Behold, the eye of the <u>LORD</u> *is* upon them that fear him, upon them that <u>hope</u> in his mercy; 22 Let thy mercy, O <u>LORD</u>, be upon us, according as we hope in thee.
- Psalms 38:15 For in thee, O <u>LORD</u>, do I <u>hope</u>: thou wilt hear, O <u>Lord</u> my <u>God</u>. Psalms 39:7 And now, <u>Lord</u>, what wait I for? my <u>hope</u> *is* in thee.
- Psalms 42:5,11 Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted in me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise him for the help of his countenance. 11 Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted within me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise him, who is the health of my countenance, and my God.
- Psalms 43:5 Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted within me? hope in God: for I shall yet praise him, who is the health of my countenance, and my <a href="https://example.com/hope.
- Psalms 71:5 For thou *art* my <u>hope</u>, O <u>Lord GOD</u>: *thou art* my trust from my youth.
- Psalms 78:7 That they might set their <u>hope</u> in <u>God</u>, and not forget the works of <u>God</u>, but keep his commandments:
- Psalms 119:166 <u>LORD</u>, I have <u>hoped</u> for thy salvation, and done thy commandments.
- Psalms 130:5,7 I wait for the <u>LORD</u>, my soul doth wait, and in his word do I <u>hope</u>. 7 Let Israel <u>hope</u> in the <u>LORD</u>: for with the <u>LORD</u> there is mercy, and with him is plenteous redemption.
- Psalms 131:3 Let Israel <u>hope</u> in the <u>LORD</u> from henceforth and for ever.
- Psalms 146:5 Happy *is he* that *hath* the <u>God</u> of Jacob for his help, whose <u>hope</u> *is* in the <u>LORD</u> his <u>God</u>:
- Psalms 147:11 The <u>LORD</u> taketh pleasure in them that fear him, in those that <u>hope</u> in his mercy.
- Jeremiah 3:23 Truly in vain *is salvation* <u>hoped</u> for from the hills, and from the multitude of mountains: truly in the <u>LORD</u> our <u>God</u> *is* the salvation of Israel.
- Jeremiah 17:7,17 Blessed *is* the man that trusteth in the <u>LORD</u>, and whose <u>hope</u> the <u>LORD</u> is. 13 O <u>LORD</u>, the <u>hope</u> of Israel, all that forsake thee shall be ashamed, *and* they that depart from me shall be written in the earth, because they have forsaken the <u>LORD</u>, the fountain of living waters.
- Jeremiah 31:17 And there is <u>hope</u> in thine end, saith the <u>LORD</u>, that thy children shall come again to their own border.
- Jeremiah 50:7 All that found them have devoured them: and their

- adversaries said, We offend not, because they have sinned against the <u>LORD</u>, the habitation of justice, even the <u>LORD</u>, the <u>hope</u> of their fathers.
- Lamentations 3:18,24,26 And I said, My strength and my hope is perished from the LORD: any portion, saith my soul; therefore will I hope in him. 26 It is good that a man should both hope and quietly wait for the salvation of the LORD.
- Ezekiel 13:6 They have seen vanity and lying divination, saying, The <u>LORD</u> saith: and the <u>LORD</u> hath not sent them: and they have made *others* to <u>hope</u> that they would confirm the word.
- Joel 3:16 The <u>LORD</u> also shall roar out of Zion, and utter his voice from Jerusalem; and the heavens and the earth shall shake: but the <u>LORD</u> will be the <u>hope</u> of his people, and the strength of the children of Israel.
- Luke 23:8 And when Herod saw <u>Jesus</u>, he was exceeding glad: for he was desirous to see him of a long *season*, because he had heard many things of him; and he <u>hoped</u> to have seen some miracle done by him.
- Acts 24:15 And have <u>hope</u> toward <u>God</u>, which they themselves also allow, that there shall be a resurrection of the dead, both of the just and unjust.
- Acts 26:6,7 And now I stand and am judged for the <u>hope</u> of the promise made of <u>God</u> unto our fathers: 7 Unto which *promise* our twelve tribes, instantly serving <u>God</u> day and night, <u>hope</u> to come. For which <u>hope</u>'s sake, king Agrippa, I am accused of the Jews.
- Romans 5:2,5 By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. 5 And <a href="hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of <a href="https://example.com/hope is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.
- Romans 15:13 Now the <u>God</u> of <u>hope</u> fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in <u>hope</u>, through the power of the Holy Ghost.
- 1 Corinthians 15:19 If in this life only we have <u>hope</u> in <u>Christ</u>, we are of all men most miserable.
- 2 Corinthians 8:5 And *this they did*, not as we <u>hoped</u>, but first gave their own selves to the Lord, and unto us by the will of God.
- Ephesians 2:12 That at that time ye were without <u>Christ</u>, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no <u>hope</u>, and without <u>God</u> in the world:
- Philippians 1:20 According to my earnest expectation and *my* hope, that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but *that* with all boldness, as always, *so* now also <u>Christ</u> shall be magnified in my body, whether *it be* by life, or by death.
- Colossians 1:27 To whom <u>God</u> would make known what *is* the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is <u>Christ</u> in you, the

hope of glory:

- 1 Thessalonians 1:3 Remembering without ceasing your work of faith, and labour of love, and patience of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ, in the sight of God and our Father;
- 1 Thessalonians 2:19 For what *is* our <u>hope</u>, or joy, or crown of rejoicing?

 Are not even ye in the presence of our <u>Lord Jesus Christ</u> at his coming?
- 2 Thessalonians 2:16 Now our <u>Lord Jesus Christ</u> himself, and <u>God</u>, even our Father, which hath loved us, and hath given *us* everlasting consolation and good <u>hope</u> through grace,
- 1 Timothy 1:1 Paul, an apostle of <u>Jesus Christ</u> by the commandment of <u>God</u> our Saviour, and <u>Lord Jesus Christ</u>, <u>which is</u> our <u>hope</u>;
- Titus 1:2 In <u>hope</u> of eternal life, which <u>God</u>, that cannot lie, promised before the world began;
- Titus 2:13 Looking for that blessed <u>hope</u>, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ;
- Hebrews 3:6 But <u>Christ</u> as a son over his own house; whose house are we, if we hold fast the confidence and the rejoicing of the <u>hope</u> firm unto the end.
- Hebrews 6:18 That by two immutable things, in which *it was* impossible for <u>God</u> to lie, we might have a strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold upon the <u>hope</u> set before us:
- Hebrews 7:19 For the law made nothing perfect, but the bringing in of a better <u>hope</u> *did*; by the which we draw nigh unto <u>God</u>.
- 1 Peter 1:3 Blessed *be* the <u>God</u> and Father of our <u>Lord Jesus Christ</u>, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively <u>hope</u> by the resurrection of <u>Jesus Christ</u> from the dead,
- 1 Peter 1:13 Wherefore gird up the loins of your mind, be sober, and <u>hope</u> to the end for the grace that is to be brought unto you at the revelation of <u>Jesus Christ</u>;
- 1 Peter 1:21 Who by him do believe in <u>God</u>, that raised him up from the dead, and gave him glory; that your faith and <u>hope</u> might be in <u>God</u>.
- 1 Peter 3:15 But sanctify the <u>Lord God</u> in your hearts: and *be* ready always to *give* an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the <u>hope</u> that is in you with meekness and fear:
